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Subject: International Workshop on Water Waves and Floating Bodies (IWWWFB)

This is the final reminder of the 39th International Workshop on Water Waves and Floating Bodies (IWWWFB), to be held at Fairmont Resort in St Andrews, Scotland, 14-17 April 2024.

The submission deadline for abstracts to IWWWFB 2024 is approaching on **January 8th**. Your participation is key, and note that attendance is exclusive to abstract submitters, whether accepted or not. We extend a special invitation to students and young researchers to engage in the workshop, fostering valuable connection with senior and established researchers to empower the next generation. Students and young researchers are encouraged to apply for the esteemed Tuck Fellowship. Additionally, we warmly invite partners and families to join us and explore Scotland while being part of the vibrant IWWWFB 2024 Partner Programme.

IWWWFB is an annual meeting of engineers, mathematicians, and researchers, focusing primarily on water waves and their effects on floating and submerged bodies. Abstracts may be accepted in related fields of speciality, provided they are sufficiently broad or profound to be of interest to this specific field. Abstracts should be of high quality in that new ideas are included in the analytical and/or numerical approaches developed. Purely experimental work should emphasize the underlying physics. Work that is still incomplete may be presented, but material already published and widely disseminated should not be reported.

- 1. **Abstract Preparation and Submission:** Authors are invited to prepare an extended abstract of no longer than 4 pages. Prospective participants should submit only one abstract as the first author. Abstracts should be submitted following the guidelines and via the online Abstract Submission Form.
- 2. **Abstract Review Procedure:** A scientific committee will review all submitted abstracts. Notifications about the status of the submissions will be sent on 26 January 2024. Accepted abstracts will be published in the IWWWFB 2024 Proceedings and presented at the Workshop.
- 3. **Oral Presentations:** The Workshop will take place in person. Each speaker presents a concise talk of about twenty minutes, followed by a five-minute discussion period. Only one presentation should be made by any one participant.
- 4. **Workshop Participation:** The programme will be in the form of a single session. To preserve an atmosphere conducive to informal discussion, attendance is restricted to authors who have submitted abstracts.
- 5. Registration: Workshop registration is open. Those who have submitted an abstract, regardless of the outcome, are warmly invited to register and participate in IWWWFB 2024. If you need a visa to enter the UK, we encourage you to submit your abstract and register as early as possible so we may issue an invitation letter for your visa application. - 6. **The Tuck Fellowship:** The Tuck Fellowship is intended to support participation in the IWWWFB by a student or young researcher. The Tuck Fellowship is restricted to students and to young researchers who have completed a research degree within the three years prior to application.
